





Barriers to Access



Insurance Out-of-Pocket Costs

Copay

- Fixed amount of money you pay when you get a prescription filled
- Formulary tiers

Coinsurance

 Percentage of the cost of the medication that you pay, after you reach your deductible

Deductible

 Amount you pay for health care services before your health insurance begins to pay

Insurance Coverage

Type/Coverage

- Publicly/government funded vs private/commercial
- Medical vs pharmacy benefit

Formulary

List of medications covered by an insurance plan

Step Therapy

 Trying less expensive options before "stepping up" to drugs that cost more

Insurance Step Therapy

- Process that encourages the use of less costly medication
- In general, you are required to try a step 1 medication, before a step 2 medication is eligible for coverage



- In order to "step up" to the treatment prescribed, your doctor must show that the required treatment is not appropriate for you
- Some plans may require you to fail more than 1 treatment

Tiered Formulary

	Tier 1	Tier 2	Tier 3	Tier 4
Type of medicine	Generic medications	Preferred brand-name medications	Non- preferred brand-name medications	Specialty drugs and biologics
Copay amount	\$5	\$35	\$55	\$75

- Generally, an insurance plan has 4 tiers of medications
- Most MS medications are in the 'specialty tier' (i.e. highest tier)
- The higher the tier, the higher the copay

Does my insurance cover my prescription?

- 1. Call your insurer directly
 - Refer to the number on the back of your card
- 2. Visit your insurer's website

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Know your type of insurance, know your benefits, and know which medications are covered.

Insurance Approval Process

Prior Authorization (PA)

 Process of obtaining approval from the insurance company before they will cover the medication prescribed by your provider

Appeal

(written letter)

 If the PA is denied, an appeal is when you ask your insurance company to reconsider its decision

Peer-to-Peer

(phone conversation)

 If the PA is denied, this is a conversation between a physician at the insurance company and your physician

Prior Authorization Process

Prescription sent to pharmacy

- Pharmacy determines that a PA is required and notifies doctor's office
- Doctor's office communicates with the insurance company the reasons why the medication was prescribed

Insurance review

- Insurance company will review your doctor's recommendations
- May take 24 hours, to up to several weeks (average 72 hours) for a decision

Prior Authorization Outcome Insurance company will decide to approve or deny coverage of the medication

Prior Authorization Denial

What happens if the PA is denied?

- Doctor may choose an alternative, but equally effective medication that will be covered/approved by your insurance
- Doctor's office can ask the insurance company for a review of the decision (i.e. appeal or peer-to-peer)

Insurance Appeal Process

(Doctor's office should do this)

- Insurance companies must tell you why they denied coverage of the medication
- Types of appeals:
 - Internal Appeal ask insurance company to conduct a full and fair review of its decision (i.e. first-level, second-level)
 - External Review independent third party review
- How long does it take for the insurance company to make a decision on the appeal?
 - May take up to 60 days (average time = 14 to 30 days)
 - Process can be expedited, if the case is urgent.
- Call your insurance to check on the status!

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Follow your medication through the approval process. Contact your insurance company or doctor's office to check on the status.

Insurance changes affecting medication coverage

- Formulary changes insurance may change preferred medication list
 - Treatment may no longer be covered or may cost more money
 - You have the right to challenge the plan's decision so you can stay on your current MS medication
 - Existing patients may be able to remain on treatment
 - Contact your doctor to notify them of the change
- Change of insurance
 - May need approval by new insurance plan
 - Contact your doctor and pharmacy to notify them of the change

Service Request Forms (SRFs) or Start Forms

- All MS medications have a start form!
 - ► Enrolls the patient into the manufacturer support program
 - Needed for injection training, copay card enrollment, free drug program enrollment, ETC!

START

HERE

- Includes prescription for medication
- Print from manufacturer's website or submit online
 - Patient portion and doctor portion need to be completed
- Assigned a patient navigator
- Pick up the phone. They will not say who they are until they confirm who you are.

What is a Specialty Pharmacy?

- Specialty pharmacy (SP): coordinates the processing, storage, delivery, and distribution of specialty drugs
- May help with the facilitation of the prior authorization
- Insurance may require you to use a specific SP
- Closed-door pharmacies that will ship your medication to your home or other designated location
- May call from an unknown number please pick up the phone to answer these calls to arrange for delivery

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Know the name and phone number of the pharmacy that fills your MS medication(s).

Bridge Therapy Programs

- Sends free medication to the patient during benefits investigation part of the approval process
- Usually for commercially/privately insured patients
- Offered by many manufacturers of MS medications
 - Including, but not limited to: Betaseron, Gilenya, Mayzent, Aubagio, Tecfidera, Mavenclad
- May last up to a full year
- Use these programs if you are going on an extended vacation, and insurance will only allow a certain amount of medication to be dispensed

Copay Card Programs

- Offered by drug manufacturing companies as a direct way to lower out-of-pocket costs for medications
- Eligibility: Patients with commercial/private insurance
 - Not need-based
 - Not for uninsured patients
 - Not for patients whose prescriptions are paid for, in part or in full, by any state or federally funded program, including but not limited to, Medicare or Medicaid, Medigap, VA, DoD, and TRICARE.
- Reduces copay to as little as \$0 on each fill
- Enroll by calling manufacturer support program for your medication

Free Drug Programs are available!

Patient Assistance Programs (PAPs)

- Programs offered by pharmaceutical companies to provide free or low cost medications to eligible patients
 - Medication shipped from PAP pharmacy
- Must complete an application
 - Complete patient consent form
 - Prescriber must complete their portion
- General eligibility requirements
 - Limited or no prescription drug coverage
 - Financial need
 - 3. Proof of U.S. residence or citizenship
- Know when you need to re-enroll!

- Free resource that notifies you when a disease fund opens
- Anyone can sign up including patients, families, and physicians
- Create a profile and subscribe to email or text notifications for MS disease fund openings
- Participating disease funds: The Assistance Fund, Good Days, HealthWell, Patient Advocate Foundation
- Review FundFinder FAQs for instructions on registering and signing up for notifications when the MS fund opens

Patient Access Network Foundation (PANF)

- Apply online at www.panfoundation.org or call 1-866-316-7263
- Assistance Amount: \$5,800 per year
 - Patients may apply for a second grant during their eligibility period subject to availability of funding
 - Automatic 90-day look-back period from eligibility start date
 - Approved for 12 months
- Eligibility Criteria
 - Must be getting treatment for MS
 - Must have Medicare insurance that covers the qualifying medication
 - The medication must be listed on PAN's list of covered medications.
 - Income must fall at or below 500% of the Federal Poverty Level
 - Must reside and receive treatment in the U.S. or U.S. territories (U.S. citizenship is not a requirement)

HealthWell



- Apply online at <u>www.healthwell.org</u> or call 1-800-675-8416
- Provides financial assistance to adults and children to cover the cost of:
 - Prescription drug copays
 - Health insurance premiums, deductibles, and coinsurance
 - Pediatric treatment costs
 - Travel costs
- Eligibility criteria:
 - Must have some form of insurance (i.e. private, Medicare, etc.)
 - 2. Income must fall at or below 500% of the Federal Poverty Level
 - 3. Must receive treatment in the U.S.

Good Days



- Apply online at www.mygooddays.org or call 1-877-968-7233
- Assistance amount: \$6,000 per year (subject to change)
- Provides financial assistance for:
 - Copay assistance
 - Healthcare premium assistance
 - Travel assistance
- Eligibility Criteria:
 - Must have a valid SSN
 - 2. Must have Medicare, military or federal medical insurance
 - 3. Income must fall at or below 500% of the Federal Poverty Level
 - 4. Must receive your treatment in the U.S.



- Apply online at <u>www.tafcares.org</u> or call 1-855-845-3663
- Assistance amount: no set amount (approved for the year)
 - Must re-apply each calendar year
- Provides financial assistance for:
 - Copays
 - Healthcare coinsurance, deductibles and premiums
 - Travel expenses (ex. hotel if traveling for infusion therapy)
- ► Eligibility criteria:
 - Income limits must contact TAF for more information
 - 2. Must have some form of insurance (i.e. private, Medicare, etc.)



- Apply online at <u>www.patientadvocate.org</u>. or call at 1-800-532-5274
- Assistance amount: \$7,000 per year
- Provides financial assistance to financially and medically qualified patients, including those insured through Medicare
 - Co-payments, co-insurance and deductibles
- Eligibility requirements:
 - 1. Must be currently insured and have some coverage for medication
 - Confirmed diagnosis of disease under which they are requesting assistance
 - 3. Must reside and receive treatment in the U.S.
 - 4. Household income of 400% or less of the Federal Poverty Guideline with consideration for the Cost of Living Index
